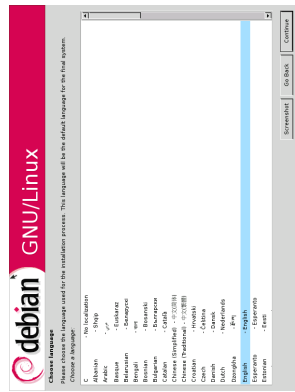


About Debian

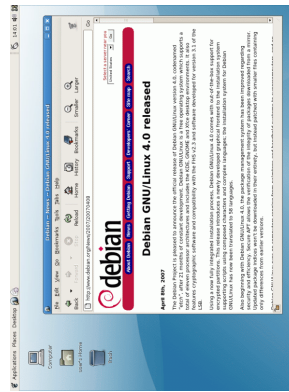

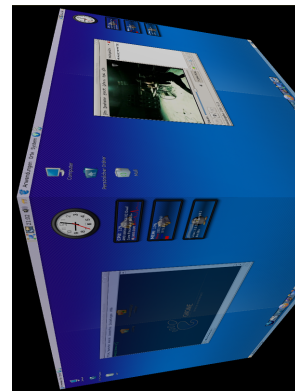

Debian GNU/Linux 4.0 "Etch" includes a number of updated software packages, such as Linux kernel version 2.6.18, GNU Compiler Collection 4.1.1, Python 2.4.4 and 2.5, Perl 5.8.8, PHP 4.4.4 and 5.2.0 and more than 18,000 other ready to use software packages.

Among many others, server software now include the mail servers Exim 4.63, Postfix 2.3, Courier 0.53 and Cyrus 2.2. It ships with the web server Apache 2.2, the database servers MySQL 5.0.32 and PostgreSQL 8.1, the OpenSSH server version 4.3, the name server Bind 9.3 and the directory server OpenLDAP 2.3.

Debian now includes the desktop environments GNOME 2.14, KDE 3.5.5a, and Xfce 4.4. Productivity applications have also been upgraded, including the office suites OpenOffice.org 2.0.4a, KOffice 1.6 and GIMP 2.2.13.

Updates of other desktop applications include the upgrade to Evolution 2.6.3 and Gaim 2.0. The Mozilla suite has also been updated, with a rename of the main programs: iceweasel (version 2.0.0.3) is the unbranded Firefox web browser and icedove (version 1.5) is the unbranded Thunderbird mail client.

With this release, Debian GNU/Linux switches from XFree86 to the 7.1 release of X.Org, which includes support for a greater range of hardware and better autodetection. This allows the use of Compiz, which is one of the first compositing window managers for the X Window System, taking full advantage of hardware OpenGL acceleration for supported devices.

Using a now fully integrated installation process, Debian GNU/Linux 4.0 comes with out-of-the-box support for encrypted partitions. This release also introduces a newly developed graphical frontend to the installation system.

The graphical installer has to be booted using installgui instead of install. Analogous, the expert and rescue modes are booted using expertgui and rescuegui respectively.
